

INTERNAL RULES - Ouillon Snowpark

1. DEFINITION

A snowpark is a specific ski slope fitted out, regulated, delimited, marked out, controlled and protected from any danger, on which are laid out one or more courses intended for the practice of acrobatics or sliding, also called freestyle or cross/carving. .

Operator: SATVAC company, concessionaire for ski lift and slope services in Le Corbier/Saint Jean d'Arves ski resorts.

2. PURPOSE

All users of the snowpark must comply with these Internal Regulations.

The operator reserves the right to modify all or part of the Internal Regulations, at any time for legitimate reasons, in particular for reasons of security, improvement of the service or to take account of legislative, regulatory or jurisprudential developments.

The amended Internal Regulations are applicable as soon as they are posted in the snowpark.

3. ACCESS

- The snowpark is accessible from its opening to its closing by the operator.
- The operator reserves the right to modify the opening hours of the snowpark according to weather conditions, the snow cover and general safety conditions.
- The wearing of an approved helmet and protections by users is strongly recommended.
- Any child under 12 must be accompanied by a responsible adult.
- The snowpark is open to beginners and experienced visitors.
- Access is only authorized for people wearing skis, snowboards, telemark, snowblade or skwal or other sliding activities authorized by the municipal decree relating to safety on the ski slopes, in force.
- The following devices are strictly prohibited: snowscoot, snowskate and their derivatives and other sliding activities not authorized by the municipal decree relating to safety on the ski slopes, in force.
- Skis, snowboards and other gliding devices must be equipped with safety straps or mechanisms preventing them from sliding on their own.

4. OBLIGATIONS OF USERS

Marking / signage / information:

All users must respect the markings and signage of the snowpark.

Security rules :

- Do not engage in an unknown course/module. Perform a preliminary recognition in order to adapt your use.
- Use only the modules/courses adapted to your technical level.
- Assess your backswing.
- Control your speed.
- Do not attempt risky figures beyond your technical level.
- Warm up before you start.
- Check that the course is free before committing yourself.
- When several of you want to take part in a module, announce your departure.
- Do not park in the flyover area, landing area or along the course.
- In the event of a fall, evacuate quickly.
- Never go back up the slope, even if you have lost equipment. Ask someone else from upstairs to bring it to you.
- Never cross a route or a module and be vigilant in all your movements.
- In the event of an accident, block the course or the module and notify the emergency service.
- To take pictures, stay out of the course.
- Inform the SATVAC runway service in charge of safety as soon as possible, as soon as you notice any element that could present a risk of endangerment.
- Leave enough space between you at each departure.
- Reminder: the area is unsupervised and taken at the risk and peril of the users.

Off the piste, users find a gliding behavior adapted to the conditions of the terrain and the flow of skiers.
